

**REDESIGN PROJECT**

## *Zone-defined space*

**THE PROPERTY** A 1930s bungalow in West Sussex

**THE DESIGN BRIEF** As part of a whole-house refurbishment, including extending the existing kitchen, The Kitchen People was commissioned to design a large family space by a couple who wanted plenty of room for when their children came home to visit.

**HOW IT WAS ACHIEVED**

'We were asked to create specific zones within the new space, so we combined two galley-style runs of Broadoak Ivory-painted cabinets from Second Nature with a natural oak central island to make the best use of the space,' says designer Sarah Lee.

'This created a defined area for clearing up after cooking and entertaining, with a Blanco Median stainless-steel sink and

dishwasher on one side of the kitchen,' she adds. 'We designed the cooking space along the opposite wall, with a dual-oven and an induction hob, both from CDA. Pulling the zones together, the central island is for food preparation and entertaining.'

A purple glass splashback above the induction hob has injected some bold colour into the scheme, which is enhanced by the bar stools and accessories.

'The classic Shaker-style units suit the design brief perfectly because, teamed with modern appliances, they highlight the mix of traditional and contemporary features,' says Sarah.

**THE COST** Around £21,000, including kitchen design and fitting but excluding building work and appliances



**ISLAND UNIT**
